Illness

Colds and tummy bugs are prevalent at this time of year and spread very easily in an establishment such as a school. If your child is at all unwell, please do not send him/her to nursery or school. If a child is vomiting, Aberdeenshire Policy states that your child must be kept off nursery/school for **48 hours after** the last time he/she vomits or has diarrhoea.

Communication

If you wish to talk to your child/ren's teacher about their progress, you are welcome to do so at any time during

the school session, but please do so through the correct channels. We would appreciate if you could contact the school office in the first instance and they will arrange a time that is suitable for both parent and teacher.

Staff Development

The Nursery staff have been getting to grips with a new e-profiling app on the iPad. We are trying out this app for Aberdeenshire Council and sent out the first lot of profile reports to parent this weekend. The e-profile replaces the paper-based profiles of the past. Not only can we email reports to parents on a fortnightly basis showing photographs of what the children have been doing in Nursery along with text stating what they were doing and the next steps in learning, but following on from discussions with Head Teachers at the feeder schools, we will be emailing these profile reports on a regular basis to the children's next destination.

Behaviour

We have had a few incidents recently where children are being excessively rough at playtime and lunchtime, even to the extent that a child's hood was ripped off his new jacket. It is often difficult for staff to get to the bottom of what exactly happened outside as the children involved will all give a different response. Alford cluster schools are taking on board a restorative approach to behavioural problems and we will be compiling a parent leaflet on restorative practice to give out to parents. What is Restorative Practice?

It is a process that puts repairing harm done to relationships and people over and above assigning blame and dispensing punishment. It shifts the emphasis from managing behaviour to focussing on building, nurturing and repairing relationships.

Staff have received some training in this approach and there will be a meeting for all interested parents shortly at Alford Academy. Date to follow.







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Mrs Freer and Mrs Shearer are currently out in the playground at break and lunchtime to support the children with their playtime games etc. This means that the children will lose some support time in the classroom but we feel that it is necessary to have our PSA's outside at the moment. We will review the situation at the Easter holidays.


ADVERSE WEATHER

Adverse Weather Website Parental/Carer Information

The Adverse weather website has been revised in light of recent experience. The key changes have been to reassign the categories to provide parents, carers, pupils and staff with appropriate information relating to their school.

Parents/Carers will still have the option to use the School Information telephone Line.

When accessing the website http://www.aberdeenshire.gov.uk/closures/ a familiar screen will be seen



There have been a number of changes to enable you to access information quickly.

Summary of School Status across Aberdeenshire:

The Closure status has been broken down into three main categories which are colour coded

• School open – including partial openings

Green

• School closed – to everyone or to pupils only

Red







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
• Disruption to transport

Blue

You also have the facility to search for your school(s) by clicking on the appropriate letter in the alphabet bar.

Below the list of schools affected by adverse weather there is a list of the unaffected schools.

Register and subscribe to receive email alerts when your school(s) updates their closure status.



Parents are advised to use the facility to receive information and updates about school closures etc by registering to receive emails. Emails will be sent automatically to your email address. If you wish emails to be forwarded to a number of email addresses you will require to register each one individually.

By clicking on the Register and subscribe you will be able to have an email sent to you automatically updating you of any changes to the schools' status. You will be able to register for updates from a number of schools by following the prompts on the screen.








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Aberdeenshire Summary Map
