Spelling Phonics units as appropriate with tasks to support understanding of words (meanings, usage and spelling).

Listening & Talking Paired, group & whole class discussions. Rehearsals, being an audience & giving feedback to others.

Numeracy Money including problem solving, position & movement, CLIC challenges and Learns Its.

Health and wellbeing: Improving performance within interval circuit training.
